We continue to celebrate and live into God's calling. There is an astounding list of ways we are witnessing the Holy Spirit move through our community. The past month alone we raised awareness and support for new churches, renewing churches, our Marshallese UCC siblings, and our church camp kids. Thank you to everyone for making these amazing things possible. Thank you to Sally Bartley, the worship committee, Carolyn Watson and Grace Caldwell of the mission group, and all those whose leadership and time made these so joyous. We also concluded two new ministry programs. One was of a book study on grief and the other was our first installment of *Everyday Theology*. The gatherings created space for us to share, listen, and deepen our communal awareness of God. Together we found how the Spirit moves us and how God's love unites us to all humanity.

The next three months there will be more ways God continues to shine and we continue to blossom. We will be blessed with two guest speakers this summer. The first is Rev. Tim Kromer of Interfaith Community Services (ICS). Rev. Tim will join us July 14 to help us celebrate our annual backpack and school supply drive. He will also tell us about the inspiring work of ICS and share how our church's partnership has empowered so many lives. The other guest speaker is Sarah Reed who heads the Rincon UCC migrant shelter. Sarah will come to help us better understand the mission of the shelter as well as various ways we are able to support the ministry.

Two other initiatives that begin this summer are new educational opportunities I will be attending on behalf of the church. The first is Next Generation Leadership Initiative (NGLI). This is a UCC program that meets twice a year for six years. The program focuses on empowering pastors and churches to thrive. The meetings explore human relationships, how communities live out their mission, and what makes faith communities excel in today's age. All six years I will be sharing the journey with the same group of sixteen clergy.

The other program is the Candler Early Career Leadership Program (CECLP). This is a two-year program that meets eight times. CECLP focuses on how the church is called to address contemporary issues such as racism, immigration, and human trafficking among others. The learning, like NGLI, is done with a clergy community. I will be with the same group of twelve clergy throughout the program. We will bring our diverse perspectives, communities, and experiences together to find Christ's way.

I want to thank the leadership and church for these opportunities. Both programs required approval and signed commitment from the church leadership. Each program's goal is to make sure our church has what it needs to be vibrant. If you have any questions or thoughts please feel free to reach out to me. Thank you. This is a community journey.

The educational opportunities and guest speakers show how God is leading us. Our path is one of life-giving revelation. The journey will bring us closer to one another, closer to our neighbors in service and love, and closer to God, Christ and the Spirit.

The newly vacant position is open to be filled by a qualified member of OVUCC. We would like to thank both Bruce and Joy Ullock for their past lay leadership at OVUCC.

The council has been active during the second quarter of 2019 in approving members of the Pastoral Relations Committee; reviewing the options to improve OVUCC signage; reviewing potential improvements to the OVUCC web site; reviewing the need for a OVUCC recognition policy; and reviewing Financial Planning and Accounting (FP&A) recommendations for church contract versions for weddings, memorials, and general events in the sanctuary and fellowship hall facilities. On June 15, the Church Council held a retreat to evaluate our OVUCC “Reason for Being” and identify a vision to improve how we communicate our commitment to the new beginning in the ministry at OVUCC. Follow-up council meetings will finalize the new vision and start the communication process with our OVUCC members and friends.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS GROUP MINISTRY

- Peggye Wall and Jim Trippel continue to volunteer for "grounds keeping" every Friday morning from 8:00-11:00 am. Kyle Koch volunteers on many Fridays as his work schedule allows. Kyle helps with the "heavy-duty" tree trimming and lifting. Carolyn Watson and Grace Berg continue the care of our lovely rose garden on the west side of the church entrance.
- On Monday, April 15, just before our Maundy Thursday evening service, it was discovered that the outside lighting was not working; this made the parking lot unsafe at night. On Wednesday, April 17, Ronnie's Handyman Service worked to make emergency repairs to the lighting. They returned in May to remove six poles and replace damaged wiring, changed wiring configuring at the exterior electrical box, and added a junction box. The cost for the repairs was \$2,574.00.
- Even with the extraordinary water-saving efforts of the Sunday morning volunteers during Fellowship Time (*see the Hospitality Group Ministry Report*) and at special events, it is still necessary that the septic system tanks be pumped about every 2-3 months at a cost each time of \$570.00.
- During the February rains, a leak was detected in a Fellowship Hall storage closet wall. Ronnie's Handyman Service inspected the roof, removed some of the slipped roof tiles, added lead sheeting to the suspect areas, caulked a large gap around a vent and repaired cracked stucco areas. The inside drywall has not been repaired. It was left open so that we could easily check the area during our upcoming rainy season. The cost to date is \$1,267.00.
- Would you consider volunteering as Convener for Building and Grounds Group Ministry? Peggye Wall did a wonderful job for over 3 years, but a new convener would be appreciated. As convener, a quarterly report is submitted for the VISION newsletter, and a springtime and wintertime work crew is organized for clean-up in and around the church buildings and grounds. Peggye would give you guidance all the way.

Ever Wonder?

Have you ever wondered how our Sanctuary is always kept clean, trash removed, and ready for Sunday?
 Have you ever wondered how our four restrooms are kept clean and sanitary?
 Have you ever wondered how the kitchen and dining area is kept clean for Fellowship Time and meetings?

Thank you to all of our attending members who are proud of our church and help to keep it neat and tidy.

But—

There is vacuuming, dry mopping, and wet mopping of floors, still to be done.

There is disinfecting and cleaning necessary for bathroom sinks and toilets.

There is dusting in the Church building and in the fellowship hall building.

There is trash that accumulates after the Service, and throughout the week in the kitchen and offices.

There are glass doors in fellowship hall to clean.

If there are special events, attended by additional people, Rosa provides the extra cleaning necessary.

At the recommendation of a past OVUCC member, Rosa Ramirez (Arcy Cleaning Service) signed a Contract for Custodial Services in January, 2007. Rosa has personally cleaned our church for the past 12 1/2 years. Without fail, she works about four hours (sometimes more) every week on both buildings.

FINANCIAL PLANNING & ACCOUNTING GROUP MINISTRY

The FP&A group has continued to meet monthly and the current group members include Stu Kraft, Convener, Marge Craven, Sally Bartley, Pam Lodefink, and Kathy Buenger. Major meeting agenda items have included: capital improvement planning, and a workshop with Nancy Ackley from the UCC Southwest Conference (SWC) as the guest speaker; finalized the church contract versions (weddings, memorial services and general events) that were forwarded to the church council for approval; and reviewed options to upgrade and reduce costs for the office printer contract which included a meeting with the Arizona Office Technologies representative. Special thanks to Pam Lodefink who extensively reviewed the background content for the contract versions, and to Janet Delgado who formatted the contracts.

The first five plus months of 2019 have resulted in a significant improvement in weekly income which allowed OVUCC to maintain a positive cash balance, and was consistent with increases in worship participation, volunteer work, and mission projects. The weekly income needed to support the 2019 OVUCC budget and meet expenses is \$3,689.67. The average weekly income to date is \$3,834.51 which is 4 % over expenses. We are grateful for the generosity of our members and friends. The following budget information provides a summary of the OVUCC expenses and the income for 2019.

MISSIONS GROUP MINISTRY

We would like to send out a big thank you for your enthusiastic and generous support of our monthly mission projects. You are the ministry.

Here are some of the generous accomplishments of this congregation.

ICS FOOD BANK

We continue to assist the Food Bank by donating non-perishable food items as requested by the Bank. Generally, peanut butter, canned meals and spaghetti sauce are requested, but any non-perishable items are welcome at any time. Since the first of the year we have donated at least 200 pounds of food. A big thank you to Bob Lyons who delivers the donations to the Food Bank weekly.

TABITHA'S KINDNESS

This is our renamed Hand to Heart Project. We continue to distribute your donated hand-made items to the appropriate charity. Since the beginning of the year, we have delivered 11 knit blankets, 6 baby quilts, 3 baby hats and 1 pair of booties to the Family First Pregnancy Center located in Oracle. Thank you for your beautiful handwork so filled with love.

FAMILY FIRST DIAPER DRIVE

April was our second annual Diaper Drive. Our goal was to donate at least 350 diapers which is the approximate amount needed to diaper a baby for a month. We almost doubled that number...we donated 600 diapers. The approximate cost to a family is \$160.00 per month so we hope the donated diapers has given a struggling family some financial relief.

RECOGNITION MONTH – MAY

Our congregation's ministry was to reach out and recognize all of the professionals who dedicate their lives to our service. We remembered nurses, fire fighters and police. Members of the Mission Committee delivered treats to nurses at Oro Valley Hospital and the Oro Valley Police Station as we shared in the National Weeks of Recognition.

PENNIES FOR HEAVEN

We are continuing to collect loose change through the year. In November we will use the money to purchase wreaths for veterans' graves. The wreaths will be placed in local cemeteries on December 14 to celebrate Wreaths Across America. There will be updates on the amount you have contributed as the coins are counted. *Note: In April we celebrated the wedding of two of our members. The couple asked their guests to bring their loose change instead of bringing a gift—\$203.00 was gifted!*

PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

From OVUCC By-laws, Section 7, page 10:

"The Pastoral Relations Committee supports and maintains an open and sensitive relationship between the Pastor and the Congregation. This enables sharing of ideas, hopes and goals between the Pastor and the Congregation. It also provides a forum in which to resolve conflict. The meetings are confidential and not open to other members of the Congregation. If members of the Congregation have pastoral relations concerns, they should communicate directly with the Pastor or with a member of the committee. After the approval and acceptance of the call for a new settled pastor, and no later than 60 days after his/her arrival, the Church Council will appoint two members from the search and call committee. The new settled pastor, after consultation with the former interim minister, will appoint two congregation members to serve on the Pastoral Relations Committee."

The Pastoral Relations Committee Members are Sally Bartley, Kyle Koch and Carol Sack.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

The Personnel Committee serves as a Human Relations Committee supporting employee relationships while keeping current with Federal and State regulations concerning employee/employer rights. The meetings are confidential and closed. Sally Bartley would like to resign so that a new group, along with Rev. Drew Terry, could care for our non-clergy employees. Three members would be adequate to form the committee. Please contact Sally or Stu Kraft (Council Moderator) if you are interested in joining this committee, or if you have questions about what is involved.

The UCC Southwest Conference is currently launching a new integrated social media platform called “b1”. We are currently investigating the feasibility of our inclusion on that platform. Our inclusion would affect how we manage our website, Facebook page, and other social media sites. Our contract with our media coordinator, Melanie Nelson, has been terminated.

Due to budget constraints, the Accounting Manager position was eliminated from the 2019 budget plan; those responsibilities have been divided between the treasurer, a financial secretary and the financial planning and accounting group. Marge Craven was appointed Treasurer and continues to handle bookkeeping responsibilities. Janet Delgado is assisting with some of the bookkeeping responsibilities until a qualified volunteer can be found and trained as Financial Secretary.


