Words of Remembering

Pastor: Gracious God, we raise voices hoarse from shouting alleluias, we

sing praises for the wonder of an empty tomb, we give thanks for

the gifts of life, of life that breaks the bonds of death. We sing songs of praise for the world You have given us, for the beauty of the earth, for the glory of the skies. As the spring deepens and the earth thaws, as green breaks through the brown of winter, we sing songs of hope for new life springing from dead soil, for the promise held in every seed that is sown.

In a time of war, fear and loss we seek the words of Your angels and the comfort of the risen Christ, "Don't be afraid. Shalom. Don't be afraid."

People: As people of faith we remember all those who courageously answered Your call of hope. People like Moses and Miriam, leading their people to freedom; like Sarah and Abraham, seeking a new life in a strange land; like Peter and Mary, proclaiming an empty tomb and life beyond the cross. We remember these and many others, named and unnamed, who have embraced Your life, Your hope, and moved into a new age.

And we trust that in remembering and retelling their stories, we too can take the leap into New Life.

Pastor: Deep among all those memories we remember the life of a Special One. Jesus, Child of Mary. Born of a woman and raised among people who struggled daily for life. Baptized by John, Jesus embraced the life to which You called. Jesus taught and preached a vision of a world where all divisions were broken down, where all had what they needed for abundant life, where the Reign of God was as real on earth as in heaven.

People: And though the powerful of this world fought back, Jesus stood strong. When offered a chance to take the easy way Jesus overcame fear and instead prayed "yet Thy will be done." Even though they put Jesus to death You raised Christ to life, vindicating the vision and bringing hope and healing to the world.

Pastor: Let us join together singing God's wonder:

Pastor:

As we gather with all God's people and creation, we remember a story told mere days ago and yet also an age ago. We remember that Jesus gathered, as we gather, with his closest loved ones in an Upper Room to share the feast of liberation. And while sharing the ancient story of freedom, Christ called them to remember the promised freedom of God's power and presence. We remember that at that table he took the bread, gave thanks for it, blessed it, broke it and passed it among them saying:

This is my body, broken by and for the world. Whenever you eat it remember me.

Then later he took the cup of wine, blessed it and passed it among them saying:

This is the cup of the New Covenant, sealed in my blood. Whenever you drink it remember me and look toward the fulfilment of God's promise.

Blessing of the Elements

Pastor:

God of Life, in the beginning Your Spirit hovered over the water, calling forth life, creating and inspiring. Send Your Spirit upon we who gather to share this meal, infuse this bread and this drink with the Spirit's power. As we eat and drink may we feel the power of Life Triumphant pulse in our veins, the fire of hope blaze in our hearts, and the joy of the Empty tomb dance in our souls. Let us know in all our hearts and all our souls and all our minds and with all our bodies that Christ who died is now alive!

Unison: Alleluia! Amen.



Christ the Lord Is Risen Today




